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Have You Registered on PremierConnect™?

The Providence Homeowner's Association is always looking for ways to improve communication and the availability of information to the residents of the community. One of the most useful tools we have available for Providence homeowners is PremierConnect™.

"Connect" is your online access to important HOA information: account balance & history, community news, CC&R's, forms, calendar of clubs, classes & events and even copies of past issues of The Providence Times. All this and much, much more. The only catch... you must be a Providence resident to view all of this and you must be registered.

Information At Your Fingertips
Once you are a registered member of PremierConnect™, you will find out how convenient and useful the site is. To access the site, all you have to do is go to www.providencehoa.com and click on the PremierConnect™ icon right in the middle of the page. From there you will be taken to the password protected part of the HOA website and can view a wealth of helpful information.

Account Information
Are you trying to track your dues payment history? Go to "Account Balance & History" and you can view your account information for the last 365 days.

Forms & Documents
Under "Forms & Documents" you can easily view the CC&Rs, Design Guidelines, Pool Rules, committee meeting minutes and much, much more. Are you planning to do some external remodeling or painting? Download the Architectural Review Committee Application Form so you can request approval before you begin your project. Are you renting the Community Center for a big party? Download the proper rental agreement so you can fill it out before you drop by the HOA office. *See more about renting Providence facilities on page 3.*

Community Calendar
Check out the calendar to see the full schedule of classes, meetings and events. If you are planning to rent a Providence facility, you can even see if that facility (Gathering Room, Community Center, etc) has already been rented on a given day.

A general overview and FAQ section is found under the "Community Details" tab. Type in a keyword and search for a quick answer regarding HOA rules, design guidelines and more.

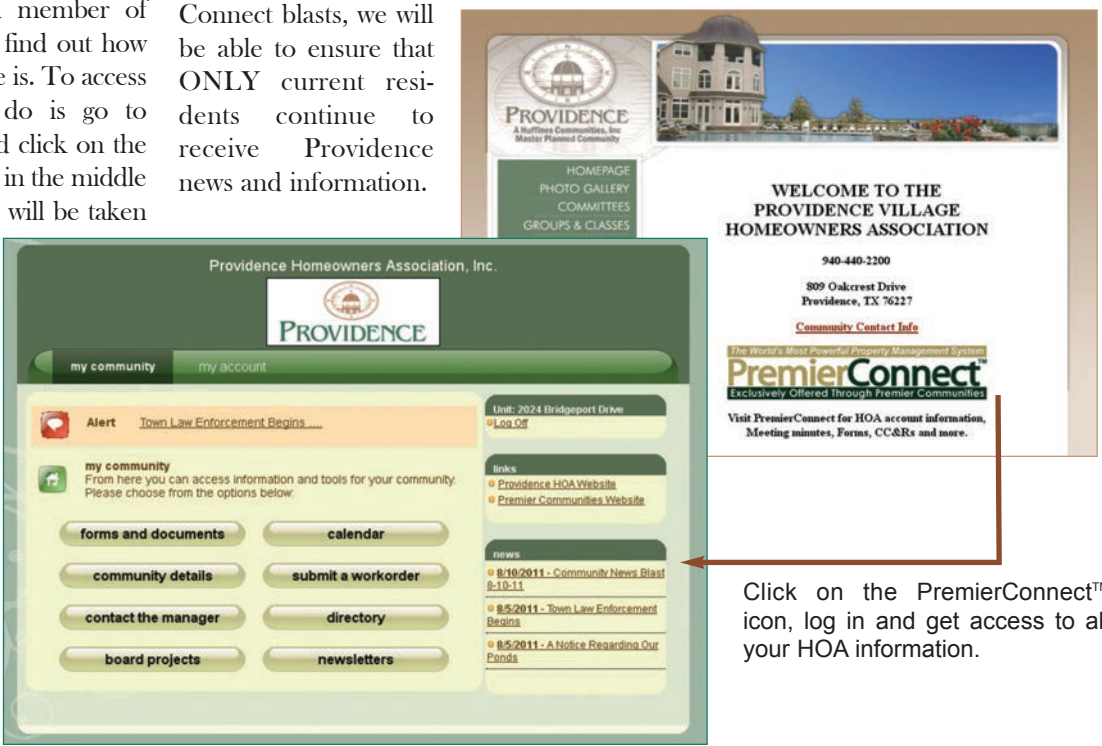
Community News Blasts!
Do you get HOA information via the weekly Community News email blasts? Well, then, it's more important than ever to register on Connect. After August 28, 2011 the HOA will be switching to the Connect system to process our community communications and only those registered on Connect will continue to receive Community News e-blasts. Because Connect is exclusive to residents of Providence Village, once we switch to Connect blasts, we will be able to ensure that ONLY current residents continue to receive Providence news and information.

New Billing Cycle; Back to Semi-Annual Dues

In an effort to fit the needs of our homeowners and ease the impact of larger payments, last October the Providence HOA switched to a quarterly dues schedule, with the payments spaced out throughout the year. Unfortunately, the result turned out to be a much higher rate of delinquency. That is why the Board of Directors has decided to go back to semi-annual billing beginning in April of 2012.

Here is how the transition to semi-annual billing will take place: The first week of September you will receive two payment coupons with your October statement. You will send each of those in with your payments when they are due (October 1 and January 1, 2012). Then, beginning in April 2012 you will resume semi-annual

dues payments, receiving two billing statements a year (April & October).

- Key Billing Dates:**
- 1st week of September 2011... Statement arrives with 2 pmt coupons
 - Oct 1st... Pmt due. Send in with coupon
 - Jan 1st... Pmt due. Send in with coupon.
 - 1st week of March 2012... Receive semi-annual billing statement
 - Apr 1...Semi-annual pmt due
 - 1st week of September 2012... Receive semi-annual billing statement
 - Oct 1...Semi-annual pmt due

In returning to the old billing cycle, it is the hope of the Board that this billing schedule will more effectively collect the necessary dues..

Quarterly dues were due in July, 2011. As you can see from the report above, not all dues have been paid. Remember, your dues pay for all the Providence amenities and events that you enjoy. Dues pay for the upkeep and maintenance that enhances the quality of life in Providence as well as property values.

If enough dues are left unpaid, it can impact the entire community. Events will be scaled back, even cancelled if necessary. As for the homeowners who don't pay dues on time, they will

find that late fees and penalties accumulate drastically the longer dues are left unpaid. Nobody wants this.

The next quarterly assessments are **DUE ON OCTOBER 1st**. Statements and the new coupon books will go out the first week in September.

If you are behind on your dues, don't ignore it. Contact Premier immediately to work out a payment arrangement. Call 877-378-2388 today and “due” your part.

Have You Finished Your Repairs?

As everyone knows, Providence Village was hit hard by the storm back in April. Many, if not most of the homes in Providence suffered damage to roofs, fences, etc.

Following the storm, homeowners began the tedious process of repairs. The HOA has been sensitive to the fact that repairs can take time. Sometimes there are hurdles as people file claims with their insurance companies, find and make arrangements with contractors and deal with such an unexpected event. We are aware that some contractors experienced difficulty acquiring the PVC fencing that many homeowners needed to replace. Knowing the delays

that many were facing, the HOA allowed extra time, but now, five months later, necessary repairs need to have been completed.

Beginning in mid August the HOA began issuing violations for storm damage not yet under repair. Now failure to complete these repairs may result in violations and fines.

To all of the Providence residents who have diligently completed their repairs... THANK YOU! Proper maintenance is the responsibility of all homeowners in the community in order to keep Providence beautiful and maintain property values.

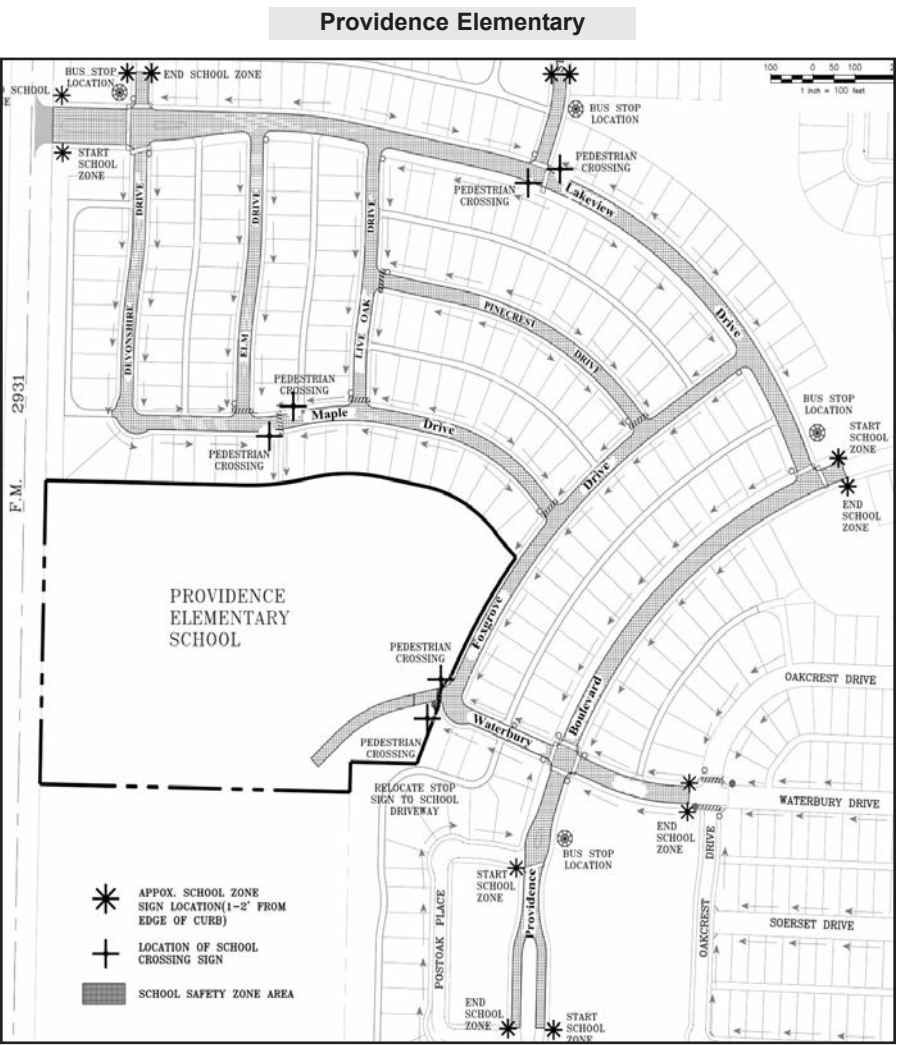
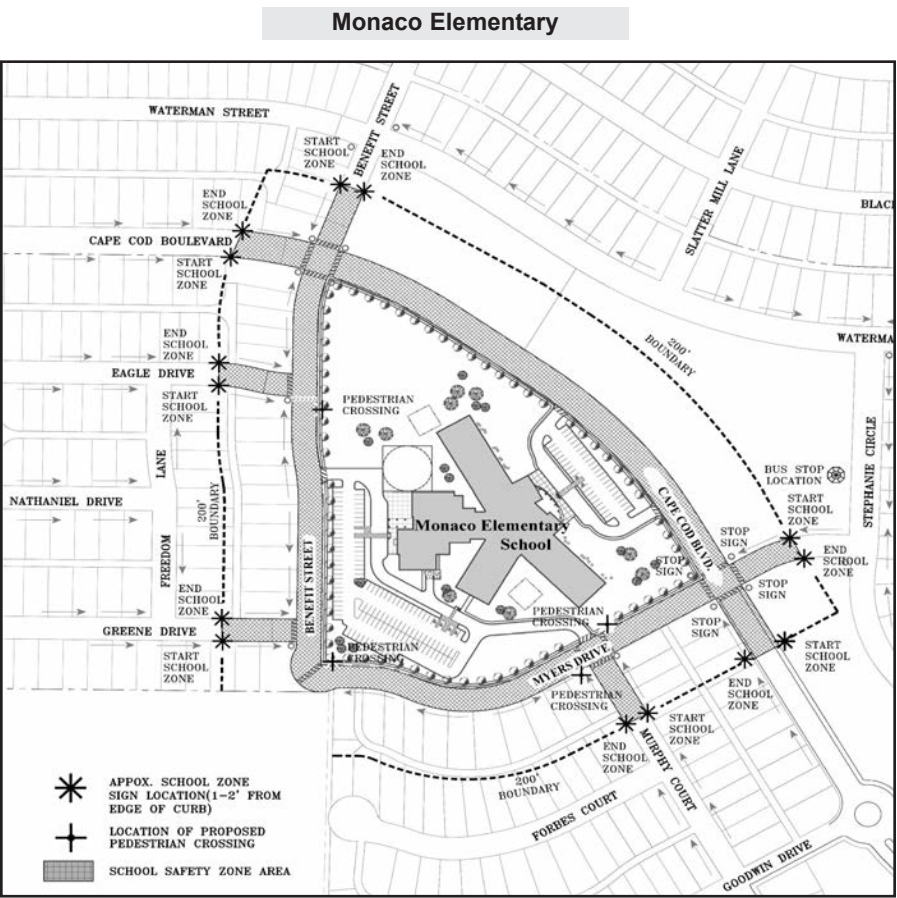
New Town Ordinances Approved and Enforcible

The Providence Village Town Council has worked for several months to complete the process establishing enforceable ordinances, including creating a municipal court and authorizing Denton County Sheriff's deputies to cite violators. All approved ordinances are now enforceable and tickets with possible fines will be issued.

A temporary building has been set up at 1745 F.M. 2931, next to Kid's Corral to serve as municipal court and town offices. Town Council meetings will be held there at a later date. Initial office hours are limited to Wednesdays from 1:00 - 4:00pm and the second and fourth Mondays from 8:00am-noon.

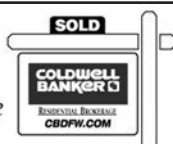

What Is Bunko?

Whether you spell it Bunko, Bunco, Bonco or Bonko, it's a game of dice, played in rounds. Players take turns rolling the dice and trying to accumulate as many points as possible to win each round. The game is typically played at tables of four in competing teams of two.

An Interesting History

According to the World Bunco Association, Bunco was originally known as "8-Dice Cloth" - a dice game in 18th-century England. It was imported to San Francisco during the Gold Rush by a crooked gambler. It was there where it gave its name to gambling parlors, or "Bunco parlors" (and more generally to any swindle). After the Civil War the game evolved to a popular parlor game. During the 1920s and Prohibition, Bunco was re-popularized as a gambling game, often associated with a speakeasy. Law-enforcement groups raiding these parlors came to be known as "Bunco squads".

Bunco as a family game saw a resurgence in popularity in the 1980s. These days playing Bunco is great way to have fun, socialize and make new friends! Providence Bunko meets the 3rd Wednesday of each month, 7pm.

Why Children Bully

The topic of bullying was covered in my previous newsletter column. This column will extend the discussion by looking at what causes some children to bully others. First, it is important to remember that children are generally not innately aggressive. They learn from their environment how to solve various issues, including conflicts, self-esteem issues insecurity. Therefore, the immediate environment and past experiences are usually good indicators of where the behavior stems from.

The Behavior is Modeled

If children witness their parents or other family members act aggressively, verbally insult others, or use overly harsh punishments, they learn indirectly that aggression is an appropriate way to deal with anger or conflict. Children these days are also exposed to many examples in the media (television & video games) where this kind of behavior is rewarded. It is important that parents teach children non-violent ways to resolve conflict, as well as teaching them empathy for others.

Poor Social Skills

Some children bully others because they are insecure (but want to hide it), are jealous of others, or don't know how to properly interact with others. They may have trouble making friends and blending in, or they may be rejected or socially isolated. Aggressive behaviors may further isolate them from others, and thus they don't have the opportunities to learn proper skills. Their disruptive and aggressive behavior gets worse with time.

Bully Victims

Children who have been bullied are often at risk of becoming bullies themselves. They may find that becoming a bully is the only way to stop the bullying from others. They take on an "attack first" defense mechanism. Bully victims may take out their frustration on others with less power, such as younger children, siblings or animals.

Looking for Acceptance

All children want to be accepted and fit in. Sometimes being an aggressor can lead to popularity, attention from peers and the appearance of being "cool." If the aggressive behavior (verbally, physically, or by spreading rumors) is rewarded with attention and status, it is likely to continue.

Group Mentality

Sometimes children engage in bullying behaviors because they simply go along with the group. Group dynamics can lead children to engage in aggressive behaviors that they would not individually engage in because they perceive their responsibility to be diminished.

Parents are often unaware of the extent to which their children engage in these behaviors. It is important to talk to your children every day and be involved in their lives. Sometimes children's behaviors at home are not indicative of how they behave elsewhere.

Artificial Sweeteners

Last time we talked about sugars. The other side of the "sweet" coin is artificial sweeteners.

ARTIFICIAL SWEETENERS, used by diabetics around the world, have been increasingly debated for years as to whether it is a savior or a poison. Sometimes people think that they are doing themselves a favor by substituting artificial sweeteners because they believe they are lowering their sugar intake, which they are. The real question becomes what are the side effects that the artificial sweeteners cause and are they less of a strain on the body than the sugar would be.

Artificial sweeteners can cause the body to crave "something," because they are unbalanced nutritionally and will cause the body to search for the missing nutritional elements. Aspartame is changed to methyl alcohol in the body, which can cause serious tissue damage, including blindness, and even death. That factor alone makes it very dangerous and there are more. You can call or email me for a FREE report, "NUTRASWEET- The Bitter Truth" which describes the politics as well as the health risks. Other sweeteners to watch out for are Equal, Sunett, Sweet One; Neotame, SugarTwin, Sweet'N Low and Splenda. Even the stevia product "Truvia," has sugar in it.

Do your research to determine if you think these are safe for you. There are a lot of websites that list the dan-

gers of artificial sweeteners. You can test for yourself whether it is safe to consume. If you regularly consume artificial sweeteners, and have headaches, muscle aches, dizziness, confusion, depression, extreme irritability or severe anxiety attacks try abstaining from any artificial sweetener for one week and see if your symptoms disappear. This is the short list of symptoms that have been reported from artificial sweeteners. No one can tell you what to eat, but sometimes the proof is in "the not eating." For myself, I don't touch them.

Whether you eat too much sugar or consume artificial sweeteners, you are setting yourself up for failure when it comes to weight control. There are even reports that artificial sweeteners cause you to gain weight. Eating lower on the food chain will help to normalize your weight or you can call for a complimentary consultation to discuss my weight balancing program.

A good option is to eat fruit when you want something sweet, and use all natural stevia to sweeten drinks and foods. Be sure to read the labels to make sure you agree with the ingredients.

Five Tips to Keep Pets Safe From the Heat

#1) Never leave your pet alone in a parked car. Parked cars are potential death traps for pets during the warm months. Even on a mild day, the temperature inside a car can quickly climb to more than 120°.

#2) Provide adequate shelter for protection from the heat if your pet lives outdoors. Outdoor kennels should be well ventilated and in a shaded area. There should always be an area where your pet can go to get out of the sun.

#3) Make sure that there is plenty of fresh drinking water available. The bowl should ideally be placed in a shaded area. Utilize a spill proof dish or provide a few bowls in case your pet tips one over.

#4) Avoid excessive exercise during hot days. Exercise is important, but over-exertion during hot weather can result in heat stress.

#5) Keep your pet well groomed. Overgrown and matted hair prevents good air circulation with your pet's skin, making it more difficult to maintain a comfortable body temperature.

#6) Be aware of symptoms of heatstroke. Heatstroke is a life-threatening

ing condition that results when pets cannot maintain a normal body temperature. The warning signs of heatstroke include panting, staring or anxious expressions, a refusal to obey commands, warm and dry skin, high body temperature, rapid heartbeat and possibly vomiting. Call your veterinarian immediately if your pet exhibits any of these signs.

The rule of thumb: if you would be uncomfortable in the environment, same (or worse) for animals.

I want to help build my child's self-esteem. I feel that there are many factors in life which can hurt this process. What are some things I can do to do as a parent to help my child develop a positive self-image?

A great way to build your child's self-image is through encouragement, exercise and healthy eating.

My motto: Eat lean to be lean. You know the old saying “You are what you eat”... well it’s true. Eating healthy is the first step to building a positive self-image. their choices will make their days to come either good or bad. Good choices = positive rewards, Bad choices = consequences. Plain and simple. Even though most children fight rules, deep down it makes them feel secure and builds self-esteem.

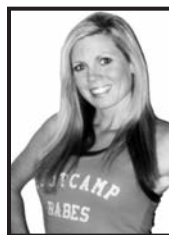
Set goals. Get a journal and have your child write down some goals that they would like to accomplish short and long term. Example: improve test scores, or make the soccer team. Once they accomplish their goals, have them go back into their journal and check it off. This can be a great self-esteem booster!

Teach your child to be assertive. There is nothing wrong with standing up for yourself as long as you do it the right way. A lot of children who go through bullying may be embarrassed and hold in their feelings, which can lead to negative self-talk, not eating, or overeating. Help your child communicate their frustrations in a positive manner, and listen to their problems no matter how small they may seem. Sometimes these problems



don't just work out, and you may have to step in to give advice or direction.

Financial Focus

Even Countries Need to Care About Credit Ratings

There's been plenty of attention paid lately to the battered state of consumer credit. But what happens when nations get low marks on their credit report cards? Like consumers, countries can get into a trouble when their ability to meet their financial obligations comes under question.

Just as there are three main credit agencies that measure and report consumer credit, there are three leading global agencies that assign and report sovereign credit ratings: Moody's Investor Service, Standard & Poor's and Fitch, Inc. Each agency uses its own scale to provide investors with a "credit bond rating," which is an assessment of a nation's ability to repay debt issues (typically bonds). High credit bond ratings help reassure investors, while low ratings turn investing into a riskier business.

Consider Ireland, for example. Only a few years ago, Ireland's economy was booming. But over the past year, as jobs have declined and tax revenues have dropped, Ireland's ratio of debt-to-gross domestic product (GDP) has snowballed. As a result, the government has been forced to cut wages and raise taxes, which in turn is stunting growth. Because of Ireland's weakened economic state, all three agencies have given the country lower marks, with Moody's Investor Service most recently downgrading Ireland's credit rating from Aa1 to Aa2. The most significant impact of Ireland's downward grading is the effect it will have on the country's ability to take on more debt. Essentially, borrowing money will be more expensive, making it even more challenging for the struggling nation to right itself financially.

Greece provides another cautionary example of financial reversal at the

Seasonal Color Impact

Seasonal color is annual plants that provide high densities of bright color within a landscape. Examples:

Spring & Summer Color - begonias, impatiens, petunias, zinnias, profusion zinnias, etc...

Fall & Winter Color - petunias, pansies, kale, violas, cabbage, etc...

Typically your seasonal color comes in 18 - 20 count flats of 4" pots. You can usually purchase different varieties of seasonal color at your local nursery or hardware store.

Seasonal color can often times make or break the landscaping of a house. Typically it's best to create small dense pockets for high & bright view impact. We would not advise placing single pot lines in front of plants. Instead, we like to carve out areas where you can create a pocket of several pots put together.

Seasonal color is often the key component in landscape designs. It is what can set one house apart from the next with similar landscapes. It's best to try and create differ-

ent heights between flowers so that a person's eye can view height coming down from the house to the walkways.

During the winter time it's great to plant things like dusty miller, then pansies or violas in front so that you have some height differences which give depth to the landscape. In the summer months you can do something similar with hibiscus as the backdrop and begonias in front.

The color patterns chosen can depend & vary based on the sun/shade tolerance of the flowers, the house color, as well as the other colors within the existing landscape. If you're looking for a great way to add a lot of pop to your landscape during the winter time, then adding some seasonal color would be a great way to help achieve this.

national level. Recently Moody's downgraded the country's bond credit rating to junk status. Such a low rating can scare off investors by suggesting that Greece's instability may affect the country's ongoing ability to repay debt.

Even the United States, which currently enjoys top credit bond ratings from all three agencies, is at risk of earning lower "grades" due to our nation's trillion-dollar budget deficit. If interest on our national debt eventually exceeds the ability of our government and economy to grow and afford debt repayments (while also paying for federal programs), we could find ourselves in the same bind as Ireland or (gasp) Greece.

There are two lessons to be learned from this discussion about sovereign credit rat-

ings. Number one: Safeguard your credit on a personal level to remain solvent and avoid excessive debt. Number two: Pay attention to credit bond ratings if you decide to invest in international markets. A qualified financial advisor can help you find ways to strengthen your own personal credit profile and invest according to your tolerance for risk.
